Overview

- **Plan:**

- I will use my PDF lecture slides to create recorded movies. I am able to write on the PDF notes with a stylus (pen) and this allows me to add extra comments/notes/graphics while I record my voice for the lecture.
- These movies will each be about 15 minutes, and 3 movies will coincide with each MWF lecture.
- See an example now in ICON under 'Online Lectures'.
- These will be *.mov* files. Apple's QuickTime programs, and Windows Media Player are all able to play *.mov* files. I believe iPad (iOS) devices will also play these files. If we have any issues, I can convert to *mp4* files (but I haven't had trouble in the past).
- I plan to upload them to ICON on the day of the lecture (by 12:30), but I may be able to upload multiple lectures early.

- **Possible Problems:**

- ① **[STORAGE SPACE]**

Each 15-minute movie is about 100MG. Right now, I have supposedly have 5200MG available to me on ICON, which means I can post about 52 movies, or about 17 lectures. But we have 7 weeks or 21 lectures left before finals week.

If every teacher at U of Iowa is posting video lectures on ICON, the system may be overwhelmed.

If I switch to Dropbox (for example), and universities across the US are posting lots of videos on Dropbox, the system may be overwhelmed... WE DON'T KNOW!!!

- ② **[TECHNICAL DIFFICULTIES]**

This could be from my end, or from your end. But I have used this process before without issue (it's just that now... everyone is trying to do similar things all at the same time.)


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Homework - office hours/help
